



Dear Parents,

We hope everyone has had a good summer and batteries are recharged ready for another busy and rewarding year ahead. We welcome our new Pre-School and Reception children as well as the new children who are starting with us in other year groups throughout the school.

As usual, over the summer we have made some **improvements to the school grounds and buildings**. Within the grounds, to enhance our OPAL provision, we have had benches installed between the boules pitch and the football pitches. This is to provide the children with an area to view activities and, more importantly, a place where they can sit and talk together. At the corner of the field we now have a 'trapeze walk', commonly known as monkey bars. Although our grounds offer a lot of physical challenge, we felt they were lacking in something to develop upper body strength. Both improvements have been funded through the £1000 we received from the Tesco award and some funding from Durham County for emotional and physical well-being. Other improvements to the school grounds have been to replace the hand rails on the steps down to the Upper School building and replacing the fencing by Pre-School with a fence/hand rail. An additional gate has been added to the pupil entrance which should allow easier flow for everyone when coming to and from school. Please continue to try to keep the entrance way free by ensuring if you are waiting for children from Upper School – stand by the fence rather than the wall. Don't forget that on a Friday the gates will not be opened until 3:05 p.m. to allow Privilege Time to be completed before parents come across the yard.

Within the buildings themselves we have removed the medical room from the Lower School which had taken away an area of one of the classrooms. The class going in was a larger one and so needed the space. We still have the medical room in the Upper School which can serve everyone. The Y3/4 toilets have been refurbished. We hope to be able to have a plan for refurbishing all children's toilets over the next few summers.

Following on from our **Parent Questionnaires** last year, we have made some changes to the way we will do things this year. You'll notice on the Dates for your Diary pages that we have changed the timing of Parent Meetings as well as adding two dates when we will send out updated information on the progress your child is making. We hope this will keep you better informed through the year.

Following the success of our Y3 Gala Theatre Concert, we have booked the theatre to repeat this for our new Y3 children. The concert will be in February and will highlight some of the musicians we have in our school as well as giving the Y3 children a chance to perform at a professional venue.

Apologies for the length of this newsletter but there is a lot to explain or remind you about at the beginning of each year and we like to keep you informed. Don't forget, if you mislay a newsletter they are all uploaded to our website. We will continue to send one paper copy of the newsletter to you as, from the parent questionnaire, it was evident that the majority of parents prefer this. With other letters we may start to email these to you to be more environmentally friendly and to make things more efficient and better value for money. It's therefore vital that we always have your most up to date email address and mobile number (see later in newsletter re Schoolcomms).

Flu Immunisation – the NHS will be carrying out this immunisation in November. As the information in this newsletter states, it is highly recommended that your child has this. It is given through a nasal spray so is simple and takes seconds. To ensure your child has this you **MUST** register them. More information is given to you in this newsletter. Please register your child as soon as you can to ensure that they are able to receive this.

The **Dates for your Diary** give you the plan for the year. It's important that you keep this as it will ensure you know what is coming up every month. There will be some additions to this as different additional opportunities arise but we will keep to this plan as much as we can.

Please read on for more news and events and, as ever, please contact us if there is anything you wish to discuss further. Otherwise we look forward to seeing you in school during the next few weeks.

This vaccination programme is in place to help protect your child against flu. Tanfield Lea Toddler Group

Our local Toddler Group Leader has asked us to mention them to you. It's a small, friendly group who meet on Wednesday mornings – 9:30 until 11 a.m. (term time only) at our local Community Centre in Tanfield Lea. It is £1.50 per child and includes a snack and a drink. Parents, Grandparents and Carers are all welcome.

COMPETITIONS/MULTISPORTS

As in previous years all children from Y1 through to Y6 will have the opportunity to take part in sports with our partner schools. Every child will have the chance to take part in a Multi-Sports Event during the year. In addition to this, teams will be selected to compete in interschool competitions. There will be one every half term (2 for each year group during the year), children will be selected following training in the P.E. session on a Friday morning. As in previous years, there will also be an additional After School Club offered to specific year groups each half term – the children attending these will have the opportunity to take part in a competition at the end of that half term. All dates for these competitions are listed on the Date for your Diary pages.

Attendance



Good attendance is crucial to good progress and also has a positive impact on well-being.

As a school we promote this with the children at every opportunity. Class attendance is discussed and celebrated every Friday during assembly. We also do a random draw for all the children who have had 100% attendance that week – the children receive a small prize and a photo of the winners is tweeted. Although Reception are not in assembly for this, the draw is done with them in their classroom and so Reception children may bring a prize home if they were a lucky winner that week.

In addition to the weekly reward every term a badge will be given to all children who have achieved 100% and a sticker awarded to those who are 98% and above. At the end of the year any children who have 100% attendance for the whole year will be awarded a small trophy to recognise this achievement.

(We do not do any of this with Pre-School children as we feel they are too young to understand.)

We constantly monitor attendance. The national target is for a school to have attendance of 96% or above. Our school attendance for 2017-2018 was 95.34%. **Our attendance for last year, 2018-2019, was an increase to 96.3%. This means surpassed our target and it's the first time we've been over 96% at the end of the school year. A great achievement which we now want to build upon.**

If a child's % dips below 95% then a text or letter, expressing concern, will be sent home informing parents of this. If it goes below 90% then further communication is made with parents and they may be invited in to school to discuss this. If absence persists then the case is referred to County Hall and a planning meeting is held with parents. Leave of Absence can significantly impact on a child's overall attendance and will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. The National Assessment period is in May (and Phonics Tests for Y1 and for some Y2 is in June) – **requests for these times must be avoided.**

Please do all you can to ensure that your child is a good attender – it's good for them now and will develop a good work ethic for life.

Praise and Recognition at Tanfield Lea Community Primary School

In the next Newsletter I will explain all the ways we give Praise and Recognition at school but within this newsletter I would like to explain the changes we have made to our Success Card system – again, following feedback from our Parent Questionnaire.



Success Card 'stamps' are awarded for something a bit special – usually in recognition of particular consistency, resilience, growth mindset, progress, behaviour, commitment, being a good citizen. These are recorded in the Personal Organiser with a brief note saying why they have got it. Once a child has 10 'stamps' then they will receive a Success Card. This is usually presented in assembly and, for Reception and Pre-School – in one of their class group session times. The Success Cards are now going to be progressive from Pre-School right through to Y6. We are no longer having the Bronze, Silver, Gold awards for each Key Stage. They will now be different every time and take the form of a country. The first to be awarded will be the United Kingdom followed by European countries and then beyond. There will be a total of 12 to achieve during their time in school.

When a child is awarded a Success Card, in addition to the certificate being awarded in assembly, a postcard will be sent out to parents telling you to watch out for the certificate and share in your child's success.

The postcards will match up with the country awarded i.e. for the United Kingdom Certificate you will receive a postcard with the British flag on and some information about United Kingdom that you can share with your child. The postcard will be sent instead of children receiving the small gifts we have previously given.

Being awarded a Success Card is a significant achievement and will take some time to be gained. Please keep an eye in your child's Personal Organiser so you can see the 'stamps' they receive during the year and what they get them for. The 'stamps' will be carried over each year so, for example, if a child has accumulated 6 'stamps' in Y1 then they will start Y2 with that number, needing only 4 more to achieve a Success Card.

The following pages list most of the main events in school throughout the year. It's important that you keep a copy so that you can keep up to date with what is happening in school.
